

# Our Recommendations for You

## Things to Do and See - Leisure Inn Waterfront Lodge, New Town - Hobart

Mount Wellington	From the top you'll see miles and miles up the Derwent Valley, down to the Southern Ocean and across to Port Arthur. The inlets, bays, hills and this beautiful city are spread out in a stunning panorama, explained in detail in the lookout at the summit. Mt Wellington is part of the Wellington Park, which includes many other recognisable landmarks, including Sleeping Beauty and Collins Bonnet.
Cadbury Visitor Centre	Visit the Cadbury Visitor Centre in Claremont. Learn the history of Cadbury, view a short film showing the production in the factory, visit the souvenir shop, chocolate shop and the cafe. You will encounter fascinating insights into the history of Cadbury Claremont - and some of the characters and products that have made Cadbury a part of growing up in Australia.
Salamanca Market	Salamanca Market takes place in Hobart every Saturday between 8.30am and 3pm - rain, hail or shine. Salamanca Market is one of those special places where you actually meet the people who create, make or grow what they sell. You can shop there for locally grown organic fruit and vegetables, freshly cut flowers, fine Tasmanian arts and crafts and an array of odds and ends.
Peppermint Bay Cruises	Hope onboard a cruise from Hobart aboard the luxury catamaran, Peppermint Bay II. The magnificent scenery will leave you spellbound on this half day cruise you will be lucky enough to see sea eagles, ancient sea-cliffs, ship wrecks, floating fish farms, and sea gardens viewed through the amazing underwater camera.
Cascade Brewery	Located a 10 minute drive from the hotel, visit the Cascade Brewery for a brewery tour or relaxing drink and a bite to eat in the Cascade Visitor Centre. One-and-a-half hour tours are conducted by guides several times per day, 7 days a week. Tours include the chance to see beers brewed in the historic brewery, tastings and a walk through the famous Woodstock gardens.
Battery Point	Battery Point is an old port and maritime village. Battery Point hosts a number of pretty buildings including the Arthur Circus Cottages and St. George's Anglican Church. You will also see Van Diemen's Land Folk Museum, a lovely Georgian building amongst beautiful grounds.
Port Arthur	Take a day out to visit Port Arthur as well as the photogenic Tasman Peninsula. Spend some time exploring the fascinating ruins of the Port Arthur historic site. Take the opportunity while you're there to view the site as the convicts once did - from aboard a cruise boat on the harbour and see the tiny convict cemetery island where the prisoners were buried.
Moorilla Winery	Situated high above the banks of the Derwent Estuary, just fifteen minutes from Hobart, Moorilla Winery produces refined cool climate wines grown in Moorilla's Tamar and Derwent Valley vineyards. Moorilla also operates a micro brewery producing four unique beers under the distinctive Moo Brew label.
Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens	The sheltered, landscaped grounds of the Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens hold historic plant collections and a large number of significant trees, many dating from the nineteenth century. Enjoy the perfect day out in Tasmania's premier garden showcasing unique flora, Sub-antarctic Plant House, Conservatory, Japanese Garden and Botanical Discovery Centre. Dine at the restaurant or picnic in the tranquil surroundings.
ZooDoo	ZooDoo is a wildlife park based on 33-hectare farm in Richmond. Go visit animals such as the Tasmanian devil, tiger quoll, koala, forester kangaroo, bennett's wallaby, pad melon wallaby as well as rare albino animals. There are a huge variety of indoor and outdoor native birds and an extensive range of domesticated and other animals including fallow deer, miniature pigs and more!
