## Things to Do and See - Leo Pacific Hotel, Melbourne

Melbourne	Melbourne is generally regarded as Australia's cultural capital. The city's features include Victorian-era architecture, extensive shopping, many cultural institutions such as museums, galleries and theatres, and large parks and gardens. You may be attending a major sporting event or to use it as a base for exploring surrounding regions such as Grampians National Park, The Great Ocean Road, and to visit Phillip Island to view the penguin parade.
Fashion & Shopping	Fashion is taken seriously in Melbourne, and whatever your style, you'll find an outlet that specialises in it, from exquisite top-name boutiques to sought-after local designs and bargain baseent specials. And if you're about to head off to explore Victoria's great outdoors, make sure you drop by one of a plethora of outdoor and adventure stores.
Eating Out	When it comes to eating out in Melbourne, you're spoiled for choice. The city's reputation is built on quality fresh produce, exciting restaurants and cafes, and a diversity of cuisines. You'll discover Australia's best gastro pubs alongside weird and wonderful cafés, mid-range restaurants of every cultural niche and, there's plenty of high class dining to be had.
Eureka Skydeck 88	Melbourne's tallest observation deck, with 360 degree views of Melbourne and the worlds only 'edge' experience - a glass cube which projects 3 metres out from the building - with you in it - suspended almost 300 metres above the ground! Located alongside the Yarra River and in the heart of the city, The Skydeck 88 is a whole new way of looking at Melbourne and the world.
Luna Park	Melbourne's Luna Park is a galaxy of amusements and sensations. From the jaw dropping, eye ball popping super thrill rides like the Pharoah's Curse, Luna Park is not just about fun rides. Ensure that your entire experience is packed with good food, fun games and cool souvenirs- so that your experience is one that you remember fondly. Luna Park is located at Lower Esplanade, St Kilda.
Melbourne Zoo	Melbourne Zoo - clearly one of the world's great zoos with more than 350 animal species from Australia and around the world are on view just 4 km from the centre of Melbourne, in a botanic garden setting of 22 hectares. The "City Explorer" day tour coach stops at the Zoo on an hourly basis, every day.
Crown Complex	Located in Southbank, Crown boasts the best variety in entertainment options around. Whether you want to catch the latest live shows, a hot new band or just sit back and enjoy the great selection of free live entertainment at a number of venues around the complex. Crown also offers a myriad of other exciting entertainment options for you to enjoy including interactive games, laser skirmish, boutique bowling and cinemas.
State Library of Victoria	Spread over 6 levels in 22 separate buildings, the State Library of Victoria covers a two-hectare city site. This is a magnificently restored heritage space right in the centre of Melbourne and easily one of the most recognised landmarks around. The library's vast resources are used for study, research, exhibitions and events. While you are there, grab a bit to eat at the cafe - Mr Tulk - featuring delicious fine food.
Federation Square	Federation Square, in the heart of Melbourne, is a relatively new destination for visitors and locals alike. Since it opened in October 2002 more than 24 million people have set foot in this innovative and architecturally stunning attraction. It houses significant cultural attractions including the Ian Potter Gallery of Contemporary Australian Art, the Australian Centre for the Moving Image and the SBS studios, as well as many fine restuarants and bars.
Chinatown	Chinatown Melbourne is the place for dining, shopping, entertainment and accommodation. It is a distinctive and well known area of Melbourne which dates back to the gold rush days of the 1850s. Chinatown Melbourne is the longest continuous Chinese settlement in the western world. Chinatown's essential character and main focus is along Little Bourke Street with alleys that link the area to Bourke Street and Lonsdale Street.
